Terrorism in Armed Conflict (TAC)

2012-2018

- Assigns specific attacks recorded in the Global Terrorism Database (GTD) to rebel organizations included in the Uppsala Conflict Data Program (UCDP)/Peace Research Institute Oslo (PRIO) Armed Conflict Data (ACD). Provides a structured, flexible coding system for assigning attacks to specific actors in order to accommodate a broad range of researcher definitions of terrorism as well as levels of uncertainty associated with identifying the attack perpetrator.
